

#### International Student FAQ

#### 1. How does HIU define an international student?

An international student is defined by meeting the following criteria:

- Enters or is in the U.S. specifically for the purpose of study.
- Does not have U.S. citizenship or legal permanent resident status but is currently in the U.S. on a non-immigrant visa (F-1, J-1, etc.)

## 2. How can I apply?

International students can apply online <u>here.</u>

## 3. Can the application fee be waived for international students?

Yes, please submit a brief statement to <a href="mailto:admissions@hartfordinternational.edu">admissions@hartfordinternational.edu</a> describing your financial need in 100-150 words. Please note: if you are applying to the MAP program, the application fee is automatically waived.

## 4. Can I study part time?

While all international students are required to study full-time; part-time study is allowed under certain circumstances. For more information see <a href="here">here</a>. Please note: part-time study is not an option for the MAP program.

## 5. Is the TOEFL/IELTS/DET required?

Students who are not native English speakers or who have not had English as a primary language of instruction in their academic studies, are required to submit scores of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), the International English Language Testing System (IELTS), or the Duolingo English Test (DET) examination and achieve a minimum score of 80 on the internet version of TOEFL or 550 on the paper-based total; 6.5 on the IELTS; or 110 on the DET. For exemptions, see <a href="here">here</a>.

#### 6. How long is a TOEFL/IELTS/DET score valid?

The exam must be taken within eighteen (18) months of your application to Hartford International University. *Online "test preparation" scores will not be accepted. And your* **application will not be processed without your official score**.

# 7. Do I need my transcript to be evaluated?

Yes, all international transcripts will need to be evaluated. For more information, please visit the International Students Admissions webpage.

# 9. Can international students apply for financial aid and scholarships?

Yes. International students can apply for institutional aid by submitting the <u>HIU Scholarship</u> and <u>Grant Supplemental Form</u>.

# 10. Can international students work on campus?

# 11. What should I do to get a student (F-1) visa?

International students need to do a few things to secure an F-1 visa. For a detailed list, see the F-1 Visa Guide.

## 12. Do I need to submit an immunization/vaccination record?

Yes, all international students must submit an immunization record to the Registrar. HIU requires all entering students to provide proof of immunity for several infectious diseases. Information about all required vaccines is available <a href="here">here</a>.

#### 13. Do I need health insurance?

Yes, all international students are required to submit proof of health insurance.

#### 14. Do I have to attend International Student Orientation?

Yes, the International Student Orientation helps students with their transition to HIU and is mandatory for all incoming students.

## 16. What is the closest airport or bus/train station?

The closest airport is <u>Bradley International Airport</u> in Windsor Locks, Connecticut. Other students have used <u>John F. Kennedy International Airport</u> in New York. If you choose this option, you will need to book a shuttle/private car with <u>Go Airport Shuttle</u>.
